### A.2. A non-technical summary of the project

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The Project Solar Power for Rural Regions in Nigeria is an Initiative by the Nigerian company PowerGen Renewable Energy Nigeria Limited and the German Non-Profit company atmosfair gGmbH to ensure reliable clean energy for businesses and residents in Nigeria. The project is already registered under the Gold Standard and includes already the interconnected Mini-Grid in Toto. As a next project installation, the project partners want to implement the Dessa project, a hybrid renewable energy system for the Park Road in Gwagwalada, to serve more than 2000 people with clean reliable and affordable power.

Currently reliant on unreliable grid power and costly diesel generators, residents and businesses face significant power interruptions. PowerGen plans to implement a hybrid renewable energy system, starting with 500kWp solar and 400kWh battery with natural gas backup, scalable to 1MW. This initiative targets 100+ buildings, providing reliable power for 14 hours daily. AEDC will be responsible for providing energy for the remain time of the day. Despite serving a limited number of connections, the project offers substantial carbon emission reductions and ensures sustainable power for more than

2000 individuals and businesses (including 1000 students), fostering economic and environmental benefits in the region. Finally, the mini-grid will offer power at lower costs than running a diesel or petrol generators to access power.

Powergen's operations, history and an overview of the intended project was presented by Mr. John Ufeoshi, a representative of Powergen. Its partnership with AEDC & atmosfair, which would augment the current power supply from AEDC was clearly explained. He further explained that the initial project focus (Phase 1) would be on the commercial shops on park road. Subsequently, depending on the success of the initial phase and approvals from AEDC, an extension beyond Park road would be deployed. The power supply period communicated is between 9am and 6pm. The asset will be built in a dedicated space in the Pilot science primary school and the price point, which is yet to be decided will be communicated in good time. However, the participants were assured that it would be more pocket-friendly (in line with regulatory guidelines) when compared to the cost of using alternate supplies (AEDC + Generators).

Mr Orezi introduced atmosfair as an international company that is focused on impact projects.
